INTRODUCTION

This story is about Joseph, one of the twelve sons of Jacob. These men were in the covenant² line as the offspring of Jacob, son of Isaac, son of Abraham. They became known as the sons of Israel.

Because Joseph was favored by his father, it caused his brothers jealousy, resentment, bitterness and almost resulted in murder. Yet God was with Joseph, and in His divine sovereignty³ fulfilled His plan, despite the great injustices he suffered.

THEME SCRIPTURE

The LORD was with Joseph, and he was a successful man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian (Genesis 39:2).

READ Genesis 40.

While Joseph was in prison, the chief butler and chief baker offended the Pharaoh, king of Egypt, so they were both thrown into the prison where Joseph was confined. While in custody, these two high officials had dreams on the same night. Noticing that they were sad, Joseph acknowledging that all dream interpretations belong to God, interpreted their dreams. According to the interpretations of the dreams, the chief butler would be restored to his position of favor, but the chief baker would be hanged. Both of the interpretations came to pass.
